Who Is Blossom Wood Day School: Blossom Wood began as a home school and continues in this tradition. Our school environment feels “homelike” and is highly child

focused. BWDS is designed to be a school where parents are visible and invested, students operate in a communal manner and faculty members share



close relationships with students to encourage their growth and development. Blossom Wood places Christian principles at the core of our work with children and our interaction with each other.

What is Scholars Club: The Scholars Club is an afterschool and “school closed day” tutorial and enrichment program for students kindergarten through sixth grade held at Blossom Wood Day School, designed to encourage academic success at school.



All Hazelwood School District and local private school students, ages 5—12, are welcome to participate in The Scholars Club.

Community Pals: This is an engagement program designed to connect our Scholars Club students with caring adults from businesses, civic and service organizations, retirees, professionals and volunteers within our community for literacy based activities.



The vision for this program is to invite the community into our school with the hope of developing long lasting relationships between Blossom Wood Day School and the community. Not only will you make a connection with our students, but also with your community.



What We Ask of Our Pals: The most important piece of Community Pals is the volunteers who want to make a difference in a schools in their community. Our program offers the opportunity to engage with a local school, serving students of varying backgrounds.

Community Pals are asked to donate one hour of time in the afternoon, the last Friday of every month for the duration of the school year, to meet with an assigned student. Mentorship may certainly evolve from participation in this program but it is not a requirement. Volunteers are asked to commit to the program for the entire school year due to the relationship building that takes place with students.
